Our young scientists are hard at work! This semester, we studied different kinds of insects including caterpillars, butterflies, and spiders. To learn about them, we read books about their lives and habitats, and learned about their bodies and movements by studying them in the garden and classroom.





Students were intrigued by these fascinating creatures, and our science lessons continue to be a favorite part of each week. In the pictures shared, students watch a butterfly perched atop some parsley, and a student makes friends with a carefully curious spider.

## Out and About in Autumn

Students, teachers, and parents alike enjoyed a perfect fall day at the Outhouse Orchards in late October. We picked perfect pumpkins, found our way through a corn maze, took a hay ride on a tractor, and some of us even got a little snooze in on the school bus ride home.

#### Barnard Meets Us at the Museums...Again!

This year, OGG is once again partnering with **Meet Me At The Museum**, a Barnard College student club that researches and prepares lectures for school groups. Last spring, our students delighted in guided visits to the Metropolitan Museum of Art and the Cooper Hewitt Museum, and we started our fall by heading back to the Met for the Armenia! exhibit currently on display. Later this year, students will also be visiting either El Museo del Barrio to learn more about the vibrant neighborhood of East Harlem, or to discover contemporary artists at the Museum of Modern Art. OGG students are the youngest visitors that this Barnard club partners with, but our energy and potential for learning makes our class a compelling group to host! Our students are enthusiastic museum visitors, and we love how these lessons incorporate Visual Thinking Curriculum strategies (which we also use in our art programming). to providing a quality, tuition-free education for the neighborhood children that was comparable to other private schools in the city. That same year she began teaching at the Storefront and remained there until the school closed in June of 2018. Keren says 129th Street is her second home and we are delighted to have her join us, still on 129th Street.



#### Yogis in Training!

Over the summer, our wonderful yoga teacher, Lalita Dunbar, furthered her goal of teaching successful childhood yoga practices, by attending an intensive workshop with a respected colleague in Yoga education, Tara Rachel Jones. The workshop included the Eight-Limbs\* of yoga philosophy, but from a child's perspective, with lesson plan strategies on how to weave yoga postures with ethics, poems and stories in a way to ignite a child's imagination. Lalita feels Yoga, in alignment with Maria Montessori's goal of "reverence for the child", helps children navigate their world, orient themselves in moments of chaos, and realize their own extraordinary potential to live a healthy, fulfilling life. And now, OGG students will benefit from her ongoing commitment and passion for early yoga education!
